

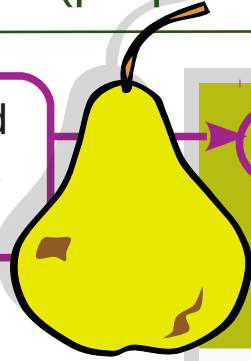
A cheat sheet on generic good software development practice
